CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Piling operations have progressed very well during this period with 275 piles completed across the site out of a total of 352. At the current rate of progress, the piling works will swiftly be completed - and the rig will be removed from site by the end of this week (week ending 28 June 2020).



The crane base works are on target for the crane delivery on the weekends of 4 and 11 July 2020. There is a considerable amount of rebar, which form a cage to reinforce the concrete and allow the cast-in crane anchor that the cranes are connected with, to be tied down when they arrive on site.

CHARITY UPDATE

Our Traffic Marshal, Bogdan, whom some of you will know from managing our entrance gate, is taking part in a charity event on Sunday 21 July 2020.

In this period we have also successfully completed the re-routing of the unplotted water main pipework in the south west corner of site.



A new trench was excavated outside our future working area, in which a new 4" MDPE pipe was laid. Before the existing pipe was disconnected, a 2" bypass pipe was installed that ensured the flow of water was maintained whilst the diversion took place.

Now that this pipe has been moved out of the way, we have completed the piling mat installation to allow the piling works to be completed on time.

UPCOMING WORKS

Once the pilers remove the rig and their equipment from site, Getjar will commence the excavation for the under slab service installations and ground floor concrete slab works. This excavation will progress from the northern end of the site working southwards, with the materials being removed being recycled to help form the remaining part of our haul road in the northern part of the site.
